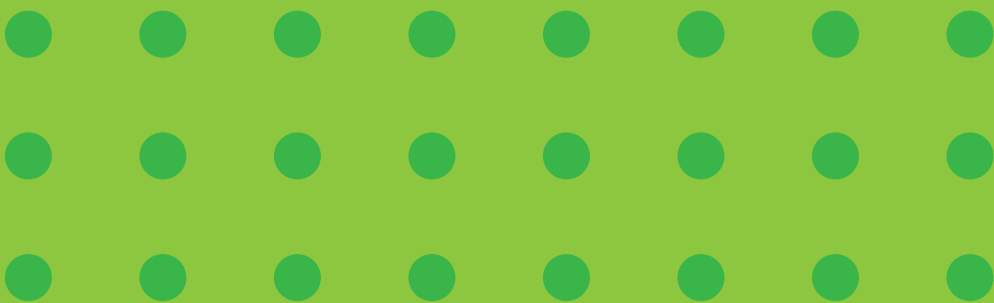

Introduction

The VET delivered to Secondary Students (VETdSS) program allows high school students to combine their regular studies with hands-on training in real industries. By completing a course, students explore career options, develop valuable skills, and earn credits toward their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

Successfully finishing a VET qualification through the VETdSS program gives students nationally recognised skills that provide a competitive edge when seeking employment or considering further training.

Students enrolled in a VETdSS course attend a South Regional TAFE campus one or two days a week, gaining practical experience in their chosen field while continuing their regular schoolwork.

This booklet covers everything you need to know about the 2026 VETdSS courses, including available qualifications and pre-apprenticeship programs, entry requirements, course delivery details, costs, and any uniform requirements (if applicable).

The VETdSS program offers students the chance to:

- Build valuable work and life skills while opening up more career options
- Get a real feel for industry expectations and develop specific skills needed for the workforce
- Boost your chances of getting a job, being selected for further training, and even create pathways to higher education down the road
- Experience studying in a more mature, adult learning environment that prepares you for the next step in your career journey

Your VETdSS Application

Everything You Need to Know About Eligibility and How to Apply

+ Who can apply?

Applications will be accepted from students who can meet the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled at a secondary school and commencing Year 11 or 12 in 2026.
 - Students commencing Year 10 may be considered for a Certificate II. Please speak with your VET Coordinator for more details.
 - Will pass or have passed Year 10 with a 'C' grade average or with Curriculum Framework Level 3.5 or better (the Year 10 mid-year report MUST be included for application purposes)*.
- *Those unable to meet this criteria can provide a reference from their school to support the application.
- Have completed and passed the online literacy and numeracy assessment (NAPLAN or OLNA).
 - Student application has been endorsed by their school.
 - School attendance may be used in application assessment (especially courses that are highly competitive).
 - Australian citizenship and/or visa requirements.
 - Year 12 Students applying for year long (i.e., 4 Terms) courses will need to commit to attending classes until mid-December.

Your VETdSS Application

Key Information to Know Before You Apply

Before we can assess your application and enrol you in a VETdSS course, it's important that you:

+ Understand the Courses

Learn about the different VETdSS courses on offer so you can choose the one that suits your interests and career goals.

+ Check the Requirements

Each course has specific entry requirements. Make sure you meet them before applying.

+ Complete the Application Steps

Follow the application process carefully and provide all the information we need.

Taking the time to understand what's involved will help make your application smoother and increase your chances of getting into the course that's right for you.

What you need to include with your application

When you apply for VETdSS, you must attach your latest school report from Semester 1, 2025, along with your NAPLAN or OLNA results. If you don't have these results, your VET Coordinator can help you get a copy.

To strengthen your application, you can also include details about any work experience, casual jobs, or volunteering you've done. It's a good idea to ask your employer or the organisation where you volunteer to write a short letter.

This letter should explain how long you've been there, how many hours you work or volunteer each week, and include a brief reference about your work ethic and attitude. This extra information can really help show your commitment and skills.

Competitive courses

Competitive courses will require an interview. Applicants must be available for an interview between

Monday 15th to Friday 26th of September 2025

Preparing for your interview

Prepare like you would for a job interview, bring a copy of your resume, any certificate or awards, portfolio if you have one. Extra experience in the chosen field will always help towards your application, e.g. volunteering, any work experience, and hobbies.

What Happens After You Apply

Once we receive your application and all supporting documents, we will carefully assess it. This process can take some time, so please be patient. If your application is successful, we will contact you around mid-October - so keep an eye on your email (including your spam or junk folder). If you're offered a place, you'll need to complete an enrolment form included in our email. Make sure you fill it out and return it promptly, as your spot can only be secured once we receive your completed form. If we don't hear back, your place may be given to someone else. Don't worry if you haven't heard from us! You might be on the waitlist, and we're still working through the process to see if we can make you an offer. This usually happens in late November.

Understanding your VETdSS Journey

Program Details and Expectations

Key program details and responsibilities

- Students attend their chosen campus 1 or 2 days a week for the allocated length of their course.
- For some Pre-apprenticeship courses, after the designated delivery requirements one of the TAFE attendance days will become a work placement day. The student will attend a work placement to put learnings into practice and gain industry experience, enhance knowledge and refine skills. Other courses may require Work-placement to occur in students own time, i.e. school holiday periods.
- You will experience learning in an adult environment with students of all ages and backgrounds.
- There is an expectation that when attending classes, you will assume greater responsibility for your own care and safety, as a responsible young adult.
- All students enrolled at South Regional TAFE are expected to adhere to the student code of conduct (a copy is located on our website).
- Whilst attending South Regional TAFE, you are under the supervision of the lecturer taking the class.
- You will not be supervised during break times.
- You are expected to remain within the College grounds unless you provide your lecturer with written notification from your parent/guardian or school.
- You are responsible for your own travel arrangements to your chosen campus and work placement (if applicable).
- You are required to attend all your classes including those that may occur on a designated school pupil free day.
- Attendance is recorded and all absences are reported to your school. You are required to notify your lecturer if you will not be attending.
- You are expected to dress appropriately whilst on campus. Some courses have uniform requirements which must be adhered to, or you may not be able to attend on that day. When special or protective clothing and/or footwear is required, it must be worn without exception.
- If the course requires work placement in a Health Care industry, Students may need to produce immunisation status evidence upon request from their workplace.

PreApprenticeships in School (PAiS)



What is the Pre-Apprenticeship in Schools program?

The PAIS program is a great opportunity for senior school students to get a head start on an apprenticeship while still at school. It's a school-based program that gives you the chance to explore different trades and gain real work experience.

Most PAIS courses run two days a week and are split between South Regional TAFE and a real workplace in your chosen trade. You'll get hands-on training at TAFE and gain practical experience on the job with an employer.



Why apply for the Pre-Apprenticeship in Schools program?

- Get industry experience while you're still in senior school
- Earn credits that count towards your WACE
- Start exploring your career options and set yourself up for an apprenticeship
- Gain practical skills that could reduce the length of your apprenticeship
- Build connections with employers and get a head start on your career

Work Placement

PAIS programs include work placements, which are a key part of the learning experience.

You'll be required to keep a logbook to track your tasks and submit it regularly. Work placement requirements will vary depending on the course, and you're responsible for arranging your own transport to and from the workplace. Some courses may also require additional hours outside of regular school time to complete your workplace training.

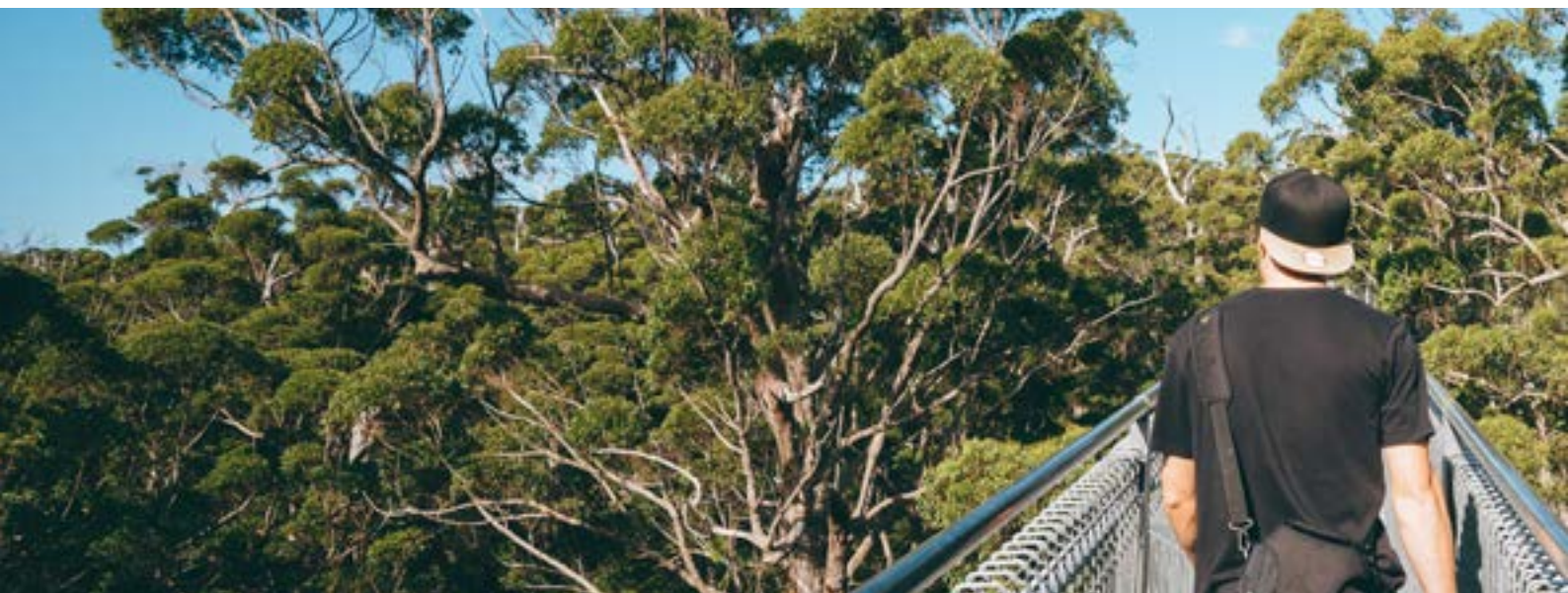
