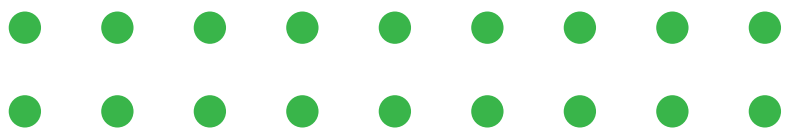

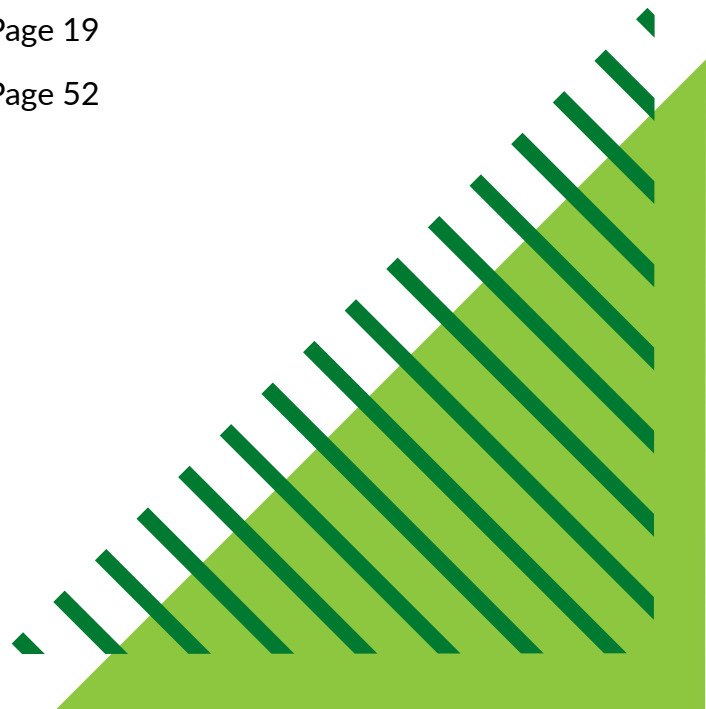

Welcome to South Regional TAFE

At South Regional TAFE, we deliver high-quality vocational education and training across the South West, Great Southern and out to Esperance - helping students build real skills for real careers.

Completing a VETDSS (Vocational Education and Training Delivered to Secondary Students) course gives you a nationally recognised qualification, along with practical, job-ready skills to support your transition into the workforce or further study - helping you stand out when applying for jobs or continuing your training.

As a VETDSS student, you will attend South Regional TAFE one or two days a week, combining hands-on learning in your chosen area with your regular school studies.

This booklet provides everything you need to know about 2027 VETDSS courses, including available qualifications and pre-apprenticeships, entry requirements, course structure, costs, and any uniform requirements.



About VETDSS

Vocational Education and Training delivered to Secondary Students

VETDSS courses are designed for high school students who want to start learning or working in a specific industry.

These courses give you practical pathways into employment after school, as well as options for apprenticeships, further study, or even university.

Get a head start on your future

- Build real work and life skills while opening up more career options
- Experience what the workplace is really like and learn skills employers want
- Boost your chances of getting a job or moving into further training—while keeping pathways to university open
- Learn in a more independent, adult-style environment that prepares you for what's next

You can complete a nationally recognised qualification alongside your WACE.

Pre-apprenticeship in Schools (PAiS)

Thinking about a trade? The PAiS program is a great way to get started while you're still at school.

In Year 11 and 12, you can combine your regular school studies with a Certificate II Pre-apprenticeship. Most courses run two days a week, split between South Regional TAFE and on-the-job training with an employer. Upon successful completion of the pre-apprenticeship, you can graduate with a nationally recognised qualification alongside your WACE, giving you a strong head start when applying for apprenticeships.

Employers value students who have already shown commitment to training, understand how TAFE works, and have basic industry knowledge and skills.

Why choose PAiS?

- Gain real industry experience while still at school
- Earn credits towards your WACE
- Explore trades and prepare for an apprenticeship
- Build practical skills that may reduce your apprenticeship time
- Connect with employers and get ahead in your career

VETDSS Higher Level Qualifications

VETDSS offers Year 11 and Year 12 students a range of Certificate III and Certificate IV qualifications to undertake while still at school.

These courses are designed to help students develop practical skills and gain real-world experience in an industry they are interested in. Higher-level certificate courses are more academically demanding, and some include mandatory work placement as part of the qualification. Certificate IV courses can also provide an alternative pathway into university.

Certificate III

Certificate III courses are a great option for you if you want to start building skills in a specific career area while still at school. These qualifications give you a more in-depth pathway than entry-level certificates and are designed to help you develop both practical and theoretical skills that align with real industry standards.

Certificate IV

Certificate IV courses are more advanced and academically demanding, and are suited to students who are ready to take the next step in their learning. These courses help you extend your skills, prepare for further study, or move into a more specific career pathway. Some Certificate IV courses may also have additional entry requirements.

Upon successful completion, a Certificate IV can also provide an alternative pathway into university.

VETDSS Certificate I & II Qualifications

VETDSS gives Year 10, 11 and 12 students the opportunity to undertake a range of entry-level Certificate I and II qualifications while still at school.

These courses provide hands-on, practical skills and industry knowledge while students continue their senior secondary education.

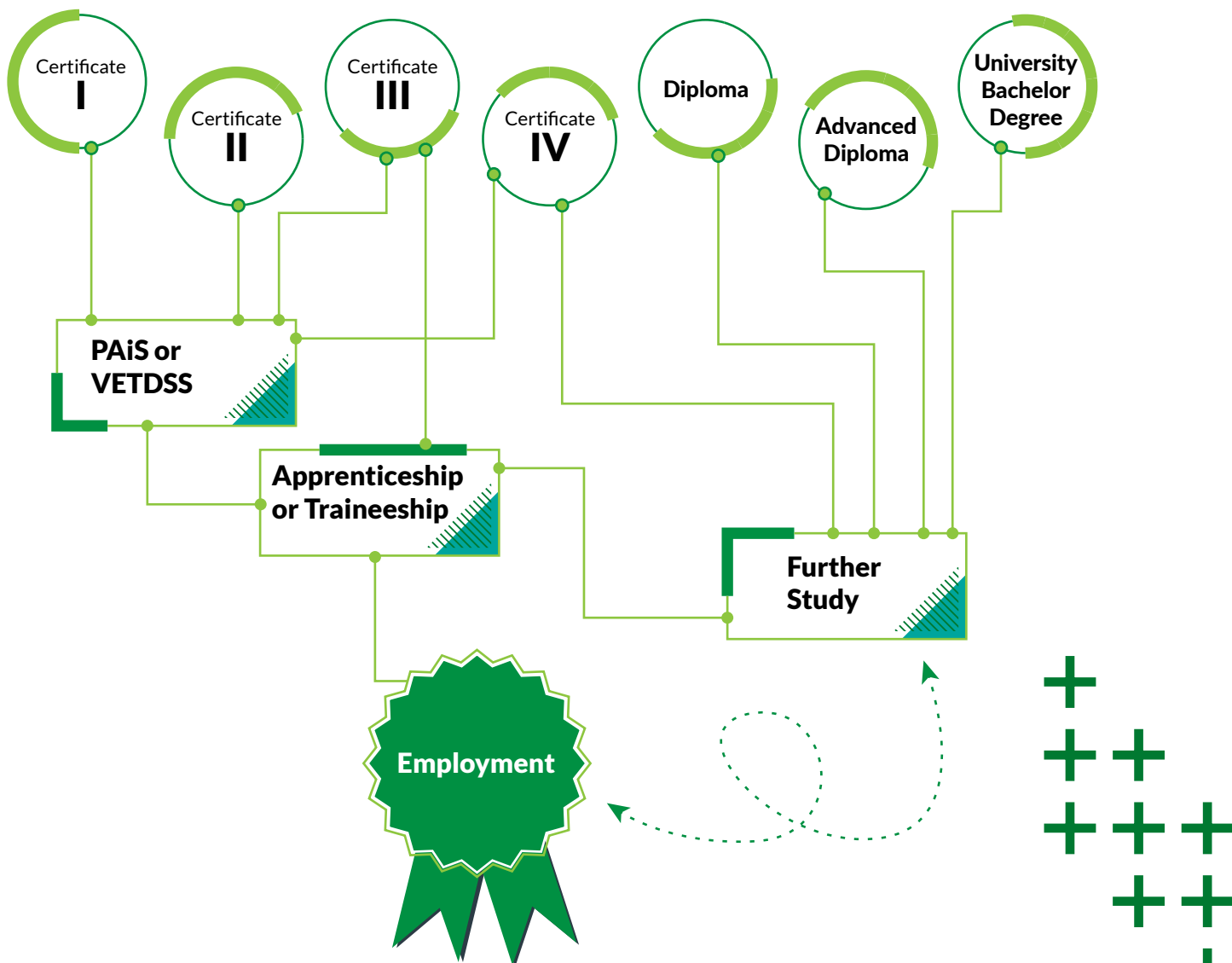
Certificate I and II courses are a great way for you to explore different career pathways, build foundational skills, and develop an understanding of a chosen industry. They can also support your future options, including further study, apprenticeships, traineeships, or entry into the workforce.

Pathways

No matter what career you are thinking about, VETDSS is a great way to get started. It allows you to study a Certificate course while you're still at school, building practical, hands-on skills that connect to real jobs and industries.

If you are considering an apprenticeship or traineeship, completing a VETDSS qualification can give you a head start and help you stand out to employers.

VETDSS also gives you the chance to explore different career options. And if you change your mind along the way, that's okay - the skills, experience, and qualifications you gain will still be valuable. They can build your confidence and support your pathway into further study, training, or employment after school.



Entrance Requirements

Fees and Charges

Secondary school students undertaking a VETDSS program as part of their studies are not required to pay tuition and resource fees.

However, depending on the course, there may be some additional costs such as uniforms, protective clothing, equipment or online subscriptions. Some courses will require you to bring your own device (BYO device). Any additional fees or requirements will be clearly outlined for each qualification.

How to Enrol

What we look for

When you apply for VETDSS, we will review how you are progressing at school. This includes your Maths and English results, your OLN outcomes, and your school attendance.

Your VET Coordinator will help by confirming these details and providing your most recent school report.

You will also have the opportunity to tell us why you are interested in your chosen course. This is your chance to stand out, so include any:

- Work experience
- Casual or part-time jobs
- Volunteering
- Personal interests (such as helping in a family business or working on projects at home)

If possible, ask an employer or volunteer supervisor for a short reference. This should outline how long you have been involved, your hours, and include a few comments about your attitude and work ethic. This extra information can really strengthen your application.

Dates

All applications for 2027 programs must be submitted via the South Regional TAFE website enrolment portal. The portal will be open from Wednesday, **29th July** to Wednesday, **19th August 2026**. Late applications will not be accepted.



What happens after you apply?

Once we receive your application and all supporting documents, we will carefully review your submission. This process will take a little time, so we ask for your patience while we work through it.

Some courses may also require an interview, which will be held between 14 and 25 September 2026.

If your application is successful, you will be contacted around mid-October - please check your email regularly, including your junk or spam folder. Your VET Coordinator will also be notified, so you can check with them if you are unsure.

If you receive an offer, you will need to complete and return the enrolment form included in your email. Your place can only be secured once we receive your completed form, so please respond promptly. It is important that you reply within 10 days, otherwise the place may be offered to another applicant.

If you don't hear from us straight away, you may be placed on a waitlist. We continue to make offers as places become available, usually through to late November/early December.

Information for Students, Parents and Guardian

Induction and Attendance

Some courses may hold information sessions before the program starts. In most cases, student orientation takes place on Day One and provides an overview of class schedules and activities, outlines expectations, and includes a health and safety induction. Students will also become familiar with the campus and meet their lecturers.

Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes, including those held on designated school pupil-free days, during school country week, and to let their lecturer know if they are going to be absent or late. Attendance is recorded, and any absences are shared with the student's school. If absences continue, the school may be contacted to discuss the student's ongoing participation in the program.

Classroom and TAFE Learning Environment

South Regional TAFE (SR TAFE) provides a mature learning environment focused on developing the skills and knowledge required in the workplace. As a result, expectations for students are similar to those in real job settings.

This means:

- Students attend their allocated SR TAFE campus 1 or 2 days per week for the duration of their course.
- In some courses, one scheduled TAFE day may become a work placement day after initial delivery requirements are met. For work placement in health or care-related industries, students may be required to provide evidence of immunisation.
- Parents/guardians are responsible for arranging transport to and from campus or placement locations.
- Students are responsible for managing their own learning, workload, and seeking support from lecturers when needed.
- Students may be required to complete assessment tasks or assignments outside of scheduled class time.
- Appropriate dress is required at all times on campus. Some courses have uniform requirements that must be followed, and students may not be permitted to attend class if these are not met. Where protective clothing or footwear is required, it must be worn at all times.
- All students enrolled at South Regional TAFE are expected to follow the Student Code of Conduct (available on our website).

Supervision

While attending South Regional TAFE, students are under the supervision of their lecturer during scheduled class times. Students are not supervised during break times.

Students are expected to remain on campus for the duration of their class unless the lecturer receives written permission from a parent/guardian or the school allowing them to leave earlier than the scheduled finish time.

Excursions

South Regional TAFE provides parents/guardians with advance information about any excursions prior to the event.

Written parental consent is required for students under 18 to participate in excursions held off campus. If consent is not provided, students will not be able to attend and SR TAFE will not be able to offer an alternative supervised activity.

Health, Safety and Student Wellbeing

South Regional TAFE is committed to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for all students by:

- Following all relevant Workplace Health and Safety (WHS) policies and procedures
- Providing trained first aid officers at all campuses
- Offering medical support and arranging emergency assistance when required
- Promoting a respectful, inclusive environment where bullying and harassment are not tolerated
- Ensuring all relevant staff hold a valid Working with Children Check
- Implementing emergency response procedures across all campuses
- Notifying parents/guardians and providing an incident report if a student is seriously injured

Insurance

Students are not covered for personal accident insurance or for loss or damage to personal property while on a South Regional TAFE campus.

However, South Regional TAFE has insurance through the Insurance Commission of WA (RiskCover), which provides personal accident cover for students during TAFE-arranged unpaid work experience, as well as approved off-campus activities such as excursions, camps, and official college trips.

Parents and guardians are responsible for deciding whether they wish to arrange additional personal accident insurance or private health cover for their child if they feel the TAFE coverage is not sufficient.

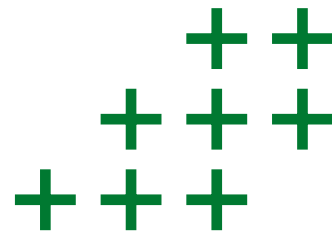

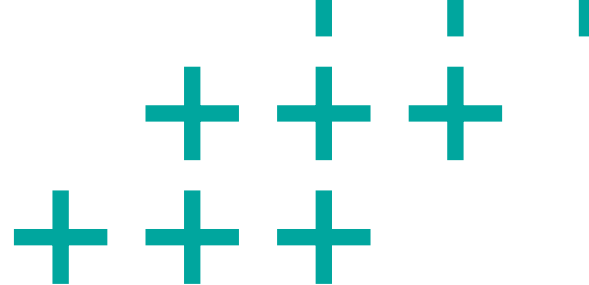

Pre-apprenticeships Course offering (PAiS)

The PAiS program gives you, as a Year 11 or 12 student, the opportunity to begin training towards a trade or industry career while still at school. You will attend South Regional TAFE for hands-on and theory-based learning two days per week with qualified lecturers, while continuing your school studies.

Once you are ready and approved, your training schedule will transition to one day per week at TAFE, alongside one day in industry. At this stage, one of your TAFE days will be replaced with a compulsory work placement, giving you valuable real-world experience, helping you build job-ready skills, and connecting you with potential employers.

The program also contributes to your WACE points and helps you explore clear career pathways, particularly into an apprenticeship after school, while giving you a strong foundation for your future studies and employment.

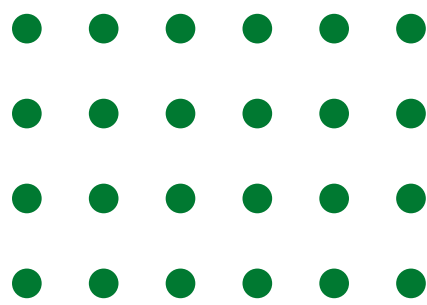
